

Welcome to Term 2. I hope that you all managed to enjoy a break in the regular school routine and found some downtime for yourselves in the process.

CHANGES IN COVID REGULATIONS IN SCHOOLS

Schools have been given relief from previous COVID regulations. These include:

- Students in years 3 6 no longer need to wear a facemask
- Close contacts no longer need to isolate. They do however need to rapid test 5 times in 7 days and wear a mask to school

- Visitors to school no longer need to show proof of vaccination and are not required to wear a mask either

Some regulations remain, however, the most significant of these being the requirement to continue to self-test 2 times a week for the first 4 weeks of this school term. More RATs have been sent home to accommodate this. It is preferred that this testing is done of a Sunday and Wednesday night, please.
