From the Principal ...

Dear Families,

Just in case you needed some reminding, remember that Monday 13th June is a public holiday in honour of the Queen's Birthday. It will be nice for us all to be able enjoy a long weekend followed by a shorter working / school week.

WELCOME BACK KEN

It was remiss of me last week not to acknowledge that it is lovely to have Ken Comer back with us after having an extended stay in Japan recently, with his mum, Nobby. Part of this experience included going to a Japanese school for a couple of weeks. I asked Ken a couple of questions in relation to his Japanese school experience and here is what he said:

What school did you attend and did they speak any English?

I attended the school that my friend in Japan went to, it is called Higashi Tokiwadai Shyogaco (you'll have to ask Ken how to pronounce that!!), in the city of Osaka. The school was very big, it was three stories high. Everyone speaks Japanese but everyone learns English from Grade 3 to Grade 6.

What was the biggest difference between school in Japan and school in Australia?

There were a lot of differences. There is only a lunch break in the day, no recess. The school makes you lunch, you don't bring your own food. You were not allowed to drink in the classroom. The classrooms use chalkboards, not whiteboards and every child has their own table to sit at. We had to change into many different pairs of shoes to wear in different parts of the school throughout the day. There was lots of homework in Japan.

How are the teachers different between the two countries?

The Japanese teachers are about 1% more strict!

Where would you rather go to school, Japan or Australia / Elmore?

I would actually like a combination of both. It is easier in Australia, because I can speak English. Also, I like to have a recess break as well as lunch and it is good not to have to change shoes all the time.

MID - YEAR REPORTS AND SEESAW POSTS

Our teachers have been busily assessing students and writing up mid-year reports over the past couple of weeks, with still a bit more work to go to complete this significant task. The Seesaw platform will include a Maths Retrieval Grid, which samples work that students have been working on all term and a sample of their writing. 

A close week this week, with Blake, Josh, Mrs Price & Mr Simpson all picking 4 winners out of 6 games.




