From the Principal ...

Dear Families,

I'm glad that winter's blast we had last week is behind us - how bizarre was that?

On a very serious note, at this time I think that it is so important that we stop and pray for those people so dramatically impacted by the earthquakes in Turkey and Syria. Tragic events such as this are hard to explain and justify to children, and to ourselves, but as a Catholic community we believe in the power of prayer to help those suffering and for those who are endeavouring to help rescue the many hundreds of people still trapped in the insidious rubble caused by the quakes.

AGE APPROPRIATE ACCESS TO NEWS

Unfortunately, news broadcasters and social media outlets have little to no concern for children having access to events like these recent earthquakes so therefore the content that is broadcast is often quite graphic in nature and potentially very disturbing for children to witness. With this in mind, please be aware of what news children are viewing as it can create an emotional response that can be difficult for them to overcome.

This will be followed by a BYO picnic back at school as a way to bring our community together and acknowledge the new beginnings of our school year. 
ELMORE TRACTOR PULL – SATURDAY 18TH MARCH



LOCAL EXCURSION PERMISSION ON PAM

Later this afternoon you should receive a request to approve a permission form on your child's PAM account. This permission form is to cover all 'Local Excursions' for the remainder of the school year.





We ask that you give permission via PAM for this as soon as possible. This will remove the need for a permission form for every event. Parents will simply be notified of the upcoming excursion via SeeSaw, email or the newsletter, so they are aware their child will be offsite.



GETTING BACK ON SIMON EVERYWHERE - SCHOOL HOLIDAY UPDATE

Over the school holidays, the team at SIMON completed a significant update to improve the security of PAM and the SIMON Everywhere app.

As part of this update, all parents were assigned new log ins using their email address as their username and sent a link to create their own password.

In order to get your SIMON Everywhere app re linked to your new account, you will need to 'Logout' of OLSH Elmore and then use the 'Add School' button to log back in with your updated username and password. To do this:

- 1. open your SIMON Everywhere app, click on the 'Tools' bar and click on the 'Logout' button.
- 2. On the next screen, press the red 'Logout' button.
- 3. Re-add OLSH by clicking the 'Add School' button
- 4. Search for 'OLSH Elmore' in the school list & click the green 'Login' button next to 'Parent Access'
- 5. Enter your new username (your email) and the new password and click submit.

Note: The forgot password button is currently not working. If you have forgotten what you set as your password, please contact the office to have a password reset link sent to your email.











Please note: If you did not completely uninstall and reinstall the SIMON Everywhere app after the last major update (in September 2022) you will also need to do this to enable all functions of the app. Checking the app for updates within the app store will not work. The app must be completely removed and reinstalled to receive the latest updates.

STUDENT INFORMATION UPDATES

Thank you to those families that have checked and returned their 'Student Information Checklist' forms that were sent home last week. If you haven't returned yours yet, we ask that you do so ASAP, even if no changes are needed.

It's also great to see that more than 2/3 of our students have also had their medical profile reviewed and updated on SIMON already. If you haven't done so, please log in to your PAM/SIMON Everywhere account and update these details as soon as possible. Students photo permissions are also included in the medical profile this year.

LUNCH ORDER PRICELIST UPDATE

Elmore Bakery have provided us with a new price list for 2023. This is the first update in prices for 3 years and we thank them for continuing to offer lunch order items to us at cheaper than retail prices.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per primary school student is \$125.

HOW TO APPLY: New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the site listed below. If you received a CSEF payment in in 2022, you do not need to complete an application form in 2023 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances (e.g. a new child starting school) or your concession card details.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE PROGRAM (CAP) 2023

The Conveyance Allowance is a form of financial assistance from the Victorian State Government to assist families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school. The allowance is available to parents who are required to —



- drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to school (if there is no school bus)
- or drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to meet the nearest school bus to the school
- the child must attend their closest government or non-government school (Catholic)
- the allowance is based on kilometres travelled and not based on any financial eligibility

Distance is calculated by the shortest practical route from home to the school or from home to meet the nearest school bus to the school. Distance can be calculated by using Bing Maps. Application Forms are available from the school office and must be completed by a parent/guardian.

Parents who received the Conveyance Allowance in 2022 do not need to complete a new form in 2023 unless their children enrolled at OLSH in 2023 have changed (i.e. Gr 6 student left at the end of 2022 or a Foundation child commenced in 2023). If your family circumstances have changed, a new form needs to be completed in 2023. If you have recently changed address please advise the office if you are no longer eligible. Application forms need to be completed and returned to the office by Friday 10 March 2023.

ROCHESTER FLOOD RELIEF GRANTS PROGRAM

ELIGIBILITY

- To be eligible, applicants must be an appropriately incorporated body/auspiced by an incorporated body, be located in the Rochester area and have been impacted by the October 2022 floods.
- Applicants must confirm that funds from both their insurance provider, the Business Victoria Business and Community Sport Flood Recovery Grants (more information here) & any other grants have been exhausted prior to seeking Community Bank funding.
- Funding must be used towards the replacement or restoration of property or equipment damaged in the 2022 floods, or towards projects or events that are designed to assist in Rochester's recovery.
