Dear Families,

Next week we celebrate a significant event on our Catholic calendar, this being **Ash Wednesday**. Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, which in turn is the lead up to Easter. Ash Wednesday serves as a reminder that we can all be better! This is not to say that we aren't already good people, who do good things for others, but rather it reminds us to continue to look outwards and see how we can both improve ourselves and support others. On **Wednesday at 2.30pm**, we will be having a liturgy here at school to honour Ash Wednesday, we welcome parents and community to come along and help us recognise this special occasion.

Shrove Tuesday

Lent was traditionally a time of fasting, where Catholics gave up something that was somewhat of a treat during Lent. Part of this tradition, was to empty the pantry of flour and sugar and the like, so that we wouldn't be tempted to eat these treats during Lent. What better way to do this than to cook up a huge batch of pancakes and lather them with all sorts of goodness!!! So, we continue to honour this tradition with a Shrove Tuesday start to our day on **Tuesday** - pancakes will be served at school between **8.30** and **9.00am**!!!

Campaspe Cluster Swimming

Next Friday, *February 24, our Year 3 - 6* students will participate in the Campaspe Cluster Swimming event. Naplan 2023

Just a reminder that Naplan is earlier this year than has previously been the case. These assessments will begin on **Wednesday March 15**. Naplan is a nationally enforced assessment regime that all Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students sit each year. It serves as some sort of guide as to how individual students are performing academically and also it gives the school some indication as to how its teaching and learning program is faring. Students are assessed in reading, writing, spelling, Maths and grammar and punctuation. More information will be sent home over the next couple of weeks in regard to this.

Out of School Hours Care - OSH Club

Just a reminder that OLSH students are able to access Out of School Hours Care at Elmore Primary School each night of the school week. The bus that picks up our country bus travellers goes directly to EPS, which means that students going to OSH care can simply hop on this bus and get dropped off right at the side gate, with the OSH club staff waiting to escort them inside. IT IS FROM THIS THAT THE TRADITION OF MAKING PANCAKES ON SHROVE TUESDAY BEGAN.

ASH WEDNESDAY BEGINS NEXT WEEK. WE WILL BEGIN LENT WITH A PRAYER SERVICE AT OLSH SCHOOL AT 2:30 PM WEDNESDAY. ALL WELCOME!

DURING THE LITURGY, ASHES ARE PLACED ON OUR FOREHEADS IN THE SHAPE OF THE CROSS. THE ASHES FOR ASH WEDNESDAY ARE NORMALLY MADE FROM BLESSED PALM BRANCHES FROM THE PREVIOUS PALM SUNDAY. THE ASHES ARE SPRINKLED WITH HOLY WATER AND INCENSED BEFORE DISTRIBUTION.

ASHES ARE A SYMBOL OF PENANCE — IN THE EARLY CHURCH, THEY WORE SACKCLOTH AND ASHES WHEN THEY WERE PERFORMING PUBLIC PENANCE. ASHES ARE ALSO A REMINDER THAT LIFE PASSES AWAY ON EARTH.


