Raising Resilient Children

One of the key ideas that we as parents have to try and internalise is that resilience is earned and not learned. In other words, our children need to experience some form of disappointment so that they can learn how to deal with this, then, as they get older and face some of life's larger challenges, they are more likely to be able to cope because of the previous experiences they are able to draw on. We don't like seeing our kids upset or hurt, but helping them through these times is better for them in the long term than simply trying to fix it for them.

Division Cross Country

On Tuesday we had Regan, Ayla and Frankie representing our cluster and school at the Division Cross Country in St. Arnaud. In extremely large fields, with students from all over the region, the girls all did an amazing job - Regan - 23rd, Ayla - 34th and Frankie - 3rd. Best of luck to Frankie as she continues on to the state championship.





Out School Hours Care Support Elmore Field Days Volunteers

OSHClub operates a daily afterschool care service for all school aged children in Elmore from 3:20pm - 6pm. The venue for this is Elmore Primary School. Students attending Our Lady of Sacred Heart PS can be transported to the venue by Dysons bus service (at no cost) at the end of their school day.

This service is not open to kindergarten aged students. We are currently seeking an Expression of Interest (EOI) for families to use this service for the for the 3 days of the Elmore Field Days, October 3 -5th.

This service will be gap free - meaning there will be no out of pocket expense for families.
