#### STUDENT ABSENCES AND LEGISLATION

Lambs on Grass - Meet local farmer Jess Conlan / Thursday August 24 Jess Conlan, with her mother Jo, operates an 850Ha sheep property called Tumbywood near Elmore.

Jess is a 2022 Nuffield Scholar who is travelling internationally to research improved ways of grass finishing lambs.

Some of the research objectives include looking at summer active pastures, grazing management techniques and trace mineral balancing.

Come to this field day on farm on August 24 to learn the role of multi–species crops in the Tumbywood farming system.

The field day will start at the Elmore Community Hub, then travel to the property for a practical session in the paddock with a multispecies crop.
