This structure allows us to avoid 2 relatively small classes in the junior and middle school, whilst having a relatively large number in the senior school. It also means that we will get to fully utilise the skill set of each classroom teacher who will be able to work quite intently with each student in their care - a rare and treasured position to be in. To accommodate this additional classroom we will utilise what is now the library space and convert it back to a classroom, as it has previously been.


If you are not planning to order any lunch, please let your teacher know so that we can make note of this.
