HOLY WEEK

The Last Supper By Cooper

The night before Jesus died he summoned his disciples to the upstairs room for a meal of bread and wine and maybe other things. Most of the disciples were scared and worried because Jesus was saying things like "I will not be with you for much longer".

In the Last Supper photo, there are no Judas or Peter. We know that Judas was finding the Romans to tell them where Jesus was so they could kill him and Peter must have left the supper.

The atmosphere of the room was tense and quiet. Initially, when you first look at the picture you think it's just a group of people having a nice meal but it means a lot more than just a meal. Jesus is sharing bread and sharing wine with all of his disciples. He broke the bread and said this is my body, take it and eat it to remember me for eternity. And then he poured a cup of red wine and said this is my blood, take it and drink it to remember me.



Lenten Mass

In his encyclical "Laudato Si," Pope Francis has implored the world to care for the environment and asked us to pray outside. Last Wednesday, OLSH School did just that by celebrating Mass as a community by the Campaspe River. Similar to last year, the weather was kind after rain the previous day. Troy Firebrace, our Aboriginal Education Officer, performed "Welcome to Country," and the students sang our Sandhurst Diocese song, "Behold, I Make All Things New." We welcomed CES staff, including Colleen Hampson, leader of Religious education; Ben Higgins, Chief Operating Officer; Michael Chisholm, Senior Aboriginal Education Officer; Louise Levy, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Officer; and Kerry Stone, Caritas Leader. Four lamps held candles, which were powerful symbols of the "Light of Christ." Our foundation learners carried a poster with the words, "Behold I Make All Things New". Thank you to the parents who attended. We look forward to making this an annual event.



WE ARE COMPASSION IN ACTION!

Sunday the 24th was Palm Sunday, which also marks the sixth week of Project Compassion. This is Caritas Australia's six-week Lenten fundraising appeal. Project Compassion is built around the theme of "For All Future Generations". This theme has been drawn from the story of the burning bush in Exodus 3:1-20. As God called Moses, so now God calls us to work for "all future generations". As Project Compassion 2024 comes to an end, I would like to take the opportunity to thank all staff and families for their generosity throughout Lent. Each class has raised funds in unique ways. The middle learners donated and sold Zooper Doopers at break times raising \$128 over two weeks and in week 9 have been busy baking to sell their items at break times for a gold coin. The decorations have been very impressive! Grade Five sold pre-loved clothing and jibbitz jewels.
